### **Minutes of the PTFC Meeting**

Shri Amitesh Bharat Singh, Commissioner of City Customs, Bengaluru, presided over the 2nd Permanent Trade Facilitation Committee (PTFC) meeting held on September 29, 2023.

#### **Record of Discussions:**

- 1. The meeting began with a welcoming address by Commissioner Shri Amitesh Bharat Singh of City Customs, Bengaluru, where he extended his greetings to all attendees.
- 2. The following mattes were discussed during the meeting:
  - a. The Additional Commissioner highlighted the importance of the Authorized Economic Operator (AEO) Program. He explained that this program aims to bolster international supply chain security and streamline the movement of legitimate goods. Under this initiative, entities engaged in international trade can attain AEO status, along with associated benefits. AEO status is categorized into three tiers: T1, T2, and T3. The Additional Commissioner urged the Federation of Indian Export Organizations (FIEO) to encourage all importers and exporters to enroll in the AEO program and guide them towards maximizing their participation.
  - b. The Chairman pointed out that CONCOR needed to complete the necessary compliance requirements, such as obtaining clearance from the State Pollution Control Board, in order to renew its appointment as a Customs Cargo Services provider under Regulation 11 of the Handling of Cargo in Customs Areas Regulations, 2009. It was urged that they promptly initiate the process and fulfill these regulatory obligations to ensure the seamless continuation of their appointment.
  - c. The Additional Commissioner also highlighted that CONCOR needed to take action to meet the requirements for providing basic amenities and facilities to the colocated Customs office at Whitefield, Bengaluru. It was emphasized that

ensuring these amenities and facilities are in place is essential for the efficient

operation of the Customs office.

d. Mr. Amalan, the General Manager at CONCOR, Whitefield, reassured that the

required actions for the renewal of the license and the provision of facilities

for the Customs Office are already in progress. He further informed that the

import side clearance is notably swift, and the same expedited clearance

process can be implemented for exports as well.

e. The Chairman underscored the pressing need to address the clearance of

containers that have been significantly delayed due to various factors. He

emphasized the paramount importance of swiftly resolving these persistent

container issues through proactive efforts from both CONCOR and the

Department. He recommended the initiation of a dedicated initiative to

expedite their clearance, thereby reducing congestion and fostering a more

organized and streamlined trade environment.

3. With no further matters to discuss, the Chairman expressed his gratitude to all

participants and brought the meeting to a close.
